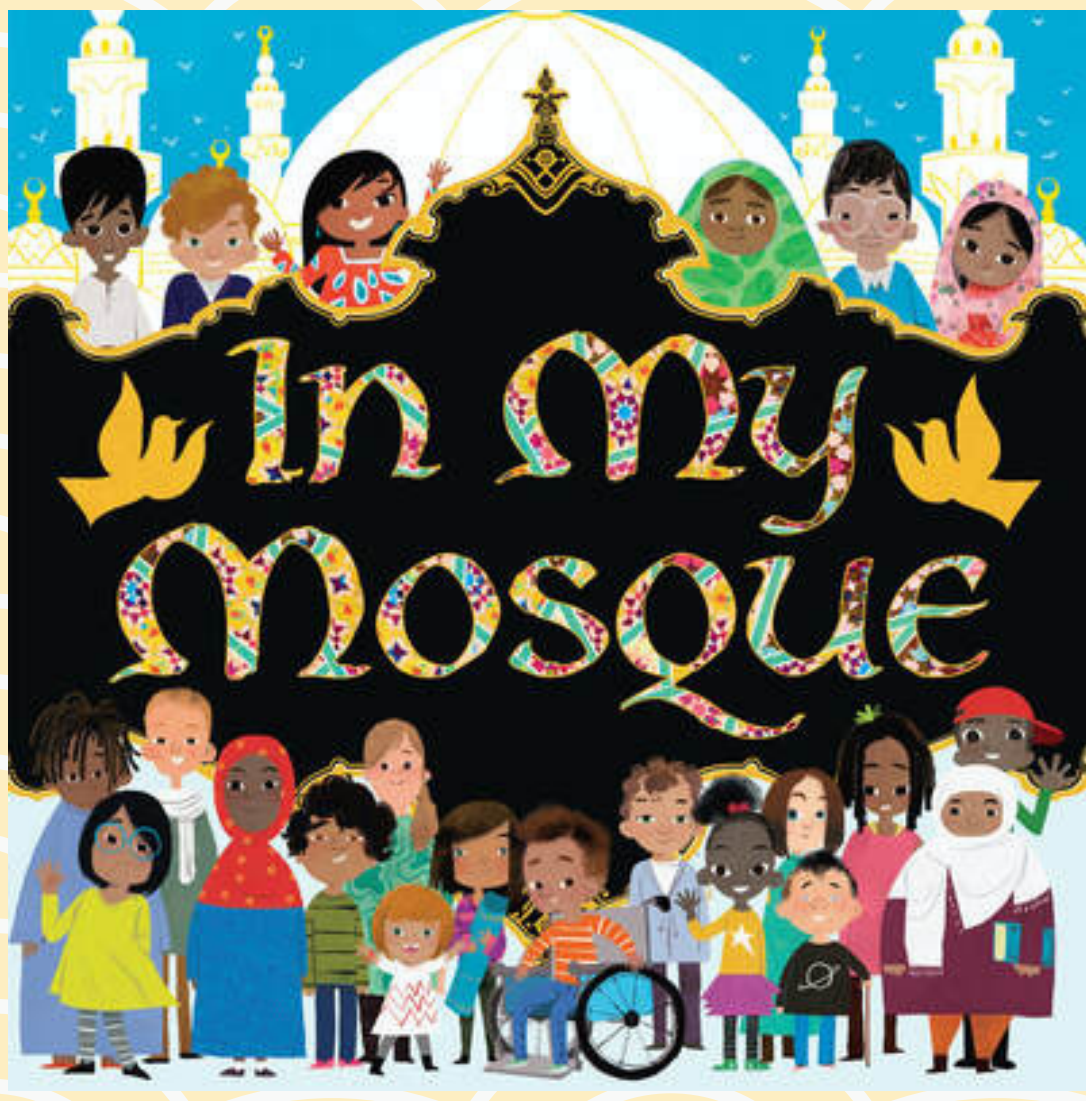

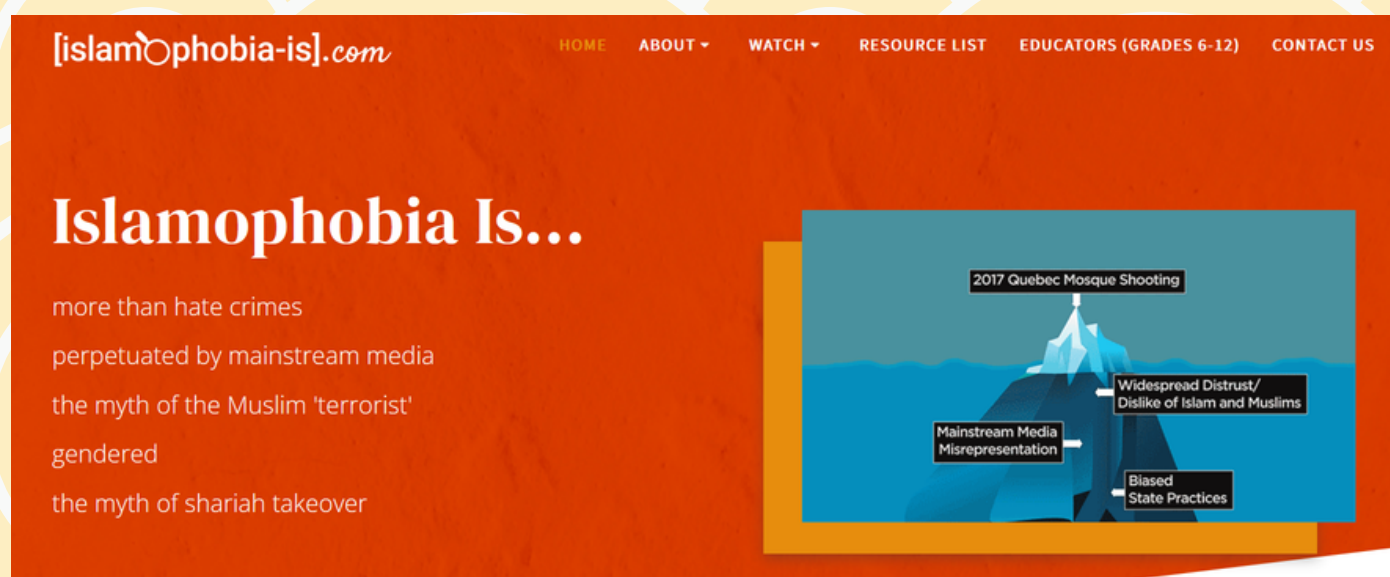


January 29th is the *National Day of Remembrance of the Quebec City Mosque Attack and Action against Islamophobia*. This is the first Day of Action after the tragic events in London, Ontario last year.
